Today I joined your student's classroom, and we talked about the social construct of "race" and discussed how people are more alike than different because we

We also emphasized that it's important to get to know people for who they are and not make judgements based on "race" or color, and we ended the lesson with students drawing a self-portrait that includes things that are important to them: family, traditions, customs, hobbies, favorite foods, etc.

Home connection: With your child, list as many similarities people across Jexas. America... the world have with one another. Then reaffirm all of the things that make him/her special and unique.
